EXAMPLES OF ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES & POSSIBLE POINT ALLOCATIONS

****BOTH IN PERSON AND VIRTUAL EVENTS ACCEPTED****

05	Attend a public meeting (maximum 5 meetings to count for points), such as any of the following: (Documentation should include the official agenda for the meeting and your brief (1 page) descriptive summary of the meeting, including major topics, decisions, etc.) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● City/town council/tribal council, or advisory board ● County board of supervisors ● State legislature or legislative committee ● State board or commission
05	Participate in a public forum on a community or political issue
05	Attend a Spirit of Service Scholar seminar (maximum 3 occasions)
05	Send email or letter to an elected official regarding a pending vote on an issue that interests or concerns you (Documentation should include a copy of your letter or email and also the official's response message. A maximum of 2 occasions eligible for point awards in this category)
10	Attend a moderator training workshop to learn how to run a public forum or other deliberative discussion.
15	Serve as a moderator or note-taker for a public forum
15	Work at the polls for a city or state election
15	Participate as an ASU student delegate to a Future Leaders Town Hall event
15-20	Participate in the Legislative Shadow program
20	Participate as an ASU student delegate to an Arizona Town Hall session
20-25	Attend a conference or participate in an internship eligible for funding from the Pastor Center
5-25	Running for and/or serving in an elected or appointed position in student government and/or serving in an elected office in student government.
25	Organize an informational workshop or presentation on an election issue, voting procedures, etc.
25	Organize a public forum on a community or political issue (either on or off campus)
25	Conduct a Voter Registration & Information Drive
25+/-	Volunteer on a campaign for a political issue or a candidate for public office (number of points awarded to be determined based on the nature and extent of work carried out)
40+/-	Serve as an appointed official on any local or state advisory board or commission (number of points awarded to be determined based on the nature and extent of work carried out)
50	Participate in and successfully complete the Spirit of Service Scholarship or Andrew Goodman Foundation scholars program
60	Run for public office (school board, city/town, state office, etc.)
80	Serve as an elected official at any level of local or state government
**	Military service may be eligible for points toward the medallion. Specify how long you were in service and any accomplishments, promotions, recognitions or honors you achieved while in service, as well as your highest rank attained.
**	Select service learning and student leadership activities will be considered on a case by case basis (please provide a description explaining how the service learning project addressed any community issues or promoted civic issue awareness and community leadership involvement of others)
